The Willamette Valley's soil type, average temperatures, rainfall and wind conditions are ideal for growing some of the world's finest Pinot Noir grapes.

The Willamette River, one of the few rivers in the world that flows northward, nurtures the valley soil. The Valley is protected from cold ocean air by the coastal range in the west and arid conditions by the Cascades to the east. The area receives an average of 40 inches of rain annually, combined with the soil conditions and the 10-15 mph ocean Van Duzer winds, giving the Willamette Valley the perfect growing conditions for our Pinot Noir.
